Subject : 2024 REVISED RULES ON GRANTING SPECIAL DISCOUNTS TO SENIOR

CITIZENS AND PERSONS WITH DISABILITY ON PURCHASE OF BASIC

NECESSITIES AND PRIME COMMODITIES.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Republic Act No. 9994 (RA9994), or the Expanded Senior Citizens Act of 2010, amending Republic Act Nos. 7432 and 9257, and Republic Act No. 10754 (RA10754), or An Act Expanding the Benefits and Privileges of Persons with Disability (PWD), amending Republic Act Nos. 7277, 9442 (RA9442), and 10070, the government may grant special discounts in special programs for Senior Citizens (SC) and PWDs on their purchase of basic commodities;

WHEREAS, the foregoing special discount granted to SCs and PWDs on their purchase of basic commodities is separate and distinct from the twenty percent (20%) discount provided under RA9994 and RA10754;

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 7581 (RA7581), or the Price Act, as amended, expanded the definition of basic necessities and prime commodities (BNPC);

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 8792, or the Electronic Commerce Act, declares that information shall not be denied validity or enforceability solely on the ground that it is in the form of an electronic data message purporting to give rise to such legal effect, or that it is merely incorporated by reference in that electronic data message. Moreover, electronic documents shall have the legal effect, validity or enforceability as any other document or legal writing;

WHEREAS, given the current inflation rate, it is relevant that the special discounts to SCs and PWDs on their purchase of BNPCs shall be for a maximum of One Hundred Twenty-Five Pesos (PHP125.00) per week without carryover of the unused amount;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the foregoing laws, rules and regulations, this Order is hereby prescribed for the information, guidance, and compliance of all concerned.

Section 1. Scope and Coverage. This Order shall be for the benefit of covered SCs and PWDs, and shall apply to all business establishments selling BNPCs mentioned under Section 2 hereof. Establishments registered under Republic Act No. 9178 (RA9178), or the Barangay Micro Business Enterprises (BMBEs) Act of 2002, are exempted from the coverage of this Order.

Section 2. Definition of Terms. For purposes of this Order, the following terms are defined as follows:

- a. **Basic Necessities** Goods that are vital to the needs of consumers for their sustenance and existence. This includes:
- 1. All kinds and variants of rice (except imported specialty rice):
 - All kinds and variants of corn
 - 3. All kinds of locally produced bread
 - 4. All locally produced fresh, dried, and canned fish, and other marine products (including those frozen, and in various modes of packaging)
 - 5. All locally produced fresh pork, beef, and poultry meat (except premium grade)
 - All fresh chicken and duck eggs
 - 7. Locally manufactured potable water in bottles and containers regardless of size
 - 8. Fresh and processed milk (excluding foods for special medical purposes)
 - Fresh vegetables including root crops
- 60 10. Fresh Fruits

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- 11. Locally manufactured instant noodles
- 12. Locally produced coffee (only whole beans, ground beans, instant up to three (3) main ingredients)
 - 13. Sugar (only muscovado, brown, washed, and refined)
 - 14. Cooking oil (only coconut oil, palm oil, soybean oil, canola oil, and vegetable oil)
- 15. Locally sourced and manufactured salt
- 16. Locally manufactured laundry and detergent soap
- 68 17. Locally produced firewood
- 69 18. Locally manufactured charcoal
 - 19. All kinds of candles (except scented)
 - 20. Household liquefied petroleum gas (LPG) with a net content of not more than eleven (11) kilograms (only once every five (5) months) bought from LPG dealers
- 73 21. Kerosene, not more than two (2) liters per month.
 - b. **Prime Commodities** Goods that are not considered as basic necessities but are essential to consumers. This includes:
 - 1. All kinds of flour
 - 2. All locally manufactured dried, processed, and canned pork, beef, and poultry meat
 - 3. All kinds of locally manufactured dairy products not falling under Section 2(a)(8) of this Order
 - 4. All kinds of onions and garlic
 - 5. Locally manufactured vinegar, patis, and soy sauce (except spiced)
- 6. All kinds of toilet or bath soap
- 7. Fertilizer
- 86 8. Pesticides
- 9. Herbicides
- 88 10. Poultry feeds, livestock feeds, and fishery feeds
- 89 11. Veterinary products
- 90 12. Paper, school supplies
- 91 13. Nipa shingle
- 92 14. Sawali
- 93 15. Cement, Clinker, GI sheets
- 94 16. Hollow Blocks
- 95 17. Plywood
- 96 18. Plyboard
- 97 19. Construction nails
- 98 20. Batteries (excluding for mobile, laptop, and automotive)

c. **Bread** – Bread is mostly lean and consists mainly of flour, water, yeast, and salt. It may be enriched with milk, sugar, butter, cheese or other flavorings. It requires kneading to develop the gluten in the flour, which provides lift and structure to the dough.

d. Electrical Supply – Those intended to maintain the operation of essential electrical installation and equipment (1) for the health and safety of persons and livestock, and/or (2) to avoid damage to the environment and to other equipment. This includes the source and the electric circuits up to the terminals of electric equipment. In certain cases, it may also include the equipment.

e. **LPG dealers** – Any person engaged in the business of selling or trading of LPG in cylinders to consumers or retail outlets, under contract with an oil company or marketer who owns a brand, and with qualified service men in its employ.

f. Foods for Special Medical Purposes – refers to category of foods for special dietary uses which are specially processed or formulated and presented for the dietary management of patients and may be used only under medical supervision. They are intended for the exclusive or partial feeding of patients with limited or impaired capacity to take, digest, absorb or metabolize ordinary foodstuffs or certain nutrients contained therein, or who have other special medically determined nutrient requirements, whose dietary management cannot be achieved only by modification of the normal diet, by other foods for special dietary uses, or by a combination of the two.

 g. Restaurant – Any business establishment that prepares and sells food or beverages to retail customers for immediate consumption, regardless of whether the food or beverages are consumed within the business premises. However, a restaurant does not include a business that primarily sells pre-packaged (canned, bottles, containers, sachet, wrap, etc.) food or beverages that are not for immediate consumption, such as a retail or wholesale grocery store; specialty food store; beer, wine, or liquor store; drug store; convenience store; newsstand; or a vending machine. Establishments such as kiosks/food carts and the like that are registered as BMBEs under RA9178 are excluded.

h. **Specialty Rice** – Rice variety (traditional or modern) possessing any special quality such as glutinous, aromatic, pigmented, japonica, and micronutrient-dense rice. It includes those varieties with excellent eating and nutritive quality (BAFS-DA, 2019).

i. Steel Wire – A steel wire of circular cross-section, produced from wire rods conforming to Philippine National Standard (PNS) 77/Adm. 01 that has been drawn and thus, cold worked. As per PNS 77/Amd. 01, low carbon steel wire rods are carbon steel wire rods of grades 1005 to 1023. It can be classified into three types such as follows:

1. Plain low carbon steel wire – an ordinary low carbon steel wire of circular cross-section with smooth surface;

2. Annealed low carbon steel wire – an ordinary low carbon steel wire that has been annealed after cold working; and

3. Zinc-coated low carbon steel wire – an ordinary low carbon steel wire annealed and coated with zinc either by hot-dipped or electrolytic galvanizing.

Section 3. Special Discount. Every SC or PWD shall enjoy a special discount of five percent (5%) of the regular retail price of BNPCs listed under Section 2 (a) and (b) of this Order, without exemption from the value-added tax (VAT). The total amount of special discount on their BNPC purchase shall not exceed One Hundred Twenty-Five Pesos (PHP125.00) per week, without carryover of the unused amount.

This special discount total amount shall be reviewed every five (5) years by the concerned agencies accounting for inflation, among others.

Section 4. General Guidelines for Availment. In the availment of the discount:

a. The SC must present his/her senior citizen identification card (ID) duly issued by an Office of the Senior Citizens Affair (OSCA), or any government-issued ID, that reflects the name, picture, and date of birth of the SC.

b. The PWD must present the Person with Disability ID, duly issued by a Persons with Disability Affairs Office (PDAO) or the City/Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office (C/MSWDO), or the National Council on Disability Affairs (NCDA).

c. If a purchaser is both an SC and a PWD, the purchaser shall only be allowed to avail of either the special discount for the SC or the special discount for the PWD.

d. If the PWD is a minor, the parents shall have full authority to purchase the covered BNPC subject to the provisions of this Order.

Section 5. Purchase Booklet. A purchase booklet provided by the concerned office shall be presented to the retailer each time a BNPC is purchased, *Provided*, that the purchase booklet may be in electronic form.

Section 6. Purchases through a Representative. An SC or PWD can authorize a person to purchase goods on her/his behalf by issuing a signed authorization letter. The authorized representative at the time of purchase shall present (1) his/her Identification Card (ID), (2) SC or PWD ID, whichever is applicable, (3) purchase booklet, (4) authorization letter, and (5) medical prescription, if applicable. The absence of any of the required documents when purchasing is a ground for the non-grant of the discount.

Section 7. Purchases through Online/E-Commerce. Business establishments selling through online/e-commerce shall grant the special discount provided in this Order. They should ensure clear and accurate display of price tags, labels, or markings, and bear the same price of their products available if sold or offered for sale in a physical store. Resolving any pricing inconsistencies in favor of the lowest displayed price is necessary to ensure equitable treatment for all purchasers.

Section 8. Effect on Other Discount or Promotions. The following rules shall apply in cases of other discounts or promotions:

a. If the establishment is mandated by RA9994 and RA10754 to grant a twenty percent (20%) discount to SCs and PWDs on purchases for the exclusive use and enjoyment of the SCs and PWDs, then the SC or PWD shall likewise enjoy the special discount provided by this Order if the products purchased belong to the BNPC list provided in this Order. In case of group or bulk order and there is a need to determine the personal consumption of the SC

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203 204 205 206	or PWD, the National Coordinating and Monitoring Board Resolution No. 3-2009, Series of 2009 or the "Resolution Clarifyung the Availment of the 20% Senior Citizens Discount in Restaurants and other Food Establishments" shall be applied.
	b. The special discount can be enjoyed on promotional offers of establishments covered by this Order regardless of whether or not the promotion requires a permit from the concerned government agency.
211212	Section 9. Exceptions. The special discount shall not be applicable during instances of Automatic Price Controls and Mandated Price Ceilings under Sections 6 and 7, respectively, of RA7581, as amended.
215 216 217 218	An automatic price control shall be immediately in effect upon the due declaration of state of disaster or calamity, emergency, martial law, rebellion, or war, or when the privilege of the writ of habeas corpus is suspended in the concerned area. The automatic price control shall be in effect for not more than sixty (60) days unless sooner lifted by the President.
	Section 10. Complaints Handling. All complaints pertaining to violation of this Order, shall be directed to the concerned OSCA, PDAO or C/MSWDO, as applicable.
223	Section 11. Penalties. Failure, refusal or delay in providing the special discount shall be penalized in accordance with RA9994 or RA9442, as applicable.
226	Section 12. Separability Clause. In the event that certain provisions of this Order are declared unconstitutional, the validity of the other provisions shall not be affected by such declaration.
229	Section 13. Repealing Clause. All issuances which are inconsistent with this Order are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.
232 233 234	Section 14. Publication and Effectivity. This Order shall take effect immediately upon its publication in a newspaper of general circulation. Three (3) copies of this Order shall be sent to the National Administrative Register at the University of the Philippines Law Center and the Official Gazette.
