Provided, that all workers/employees of these establishments have been fully vaccinated against COVID-19. Relevant joint guidelines of DTI and DOT on minimum public health standards shall be enforced and observed.

# In-person religious gatherings

**Outdoor** 

30% allowed

Regardless of vaccination status

Indoor

10% allowed

Fully vaccinated individuals only

in addition to their allowed outdoor capacities

Provided, that pastors, priests, rabbis, imams, or other religious ministers and the assistants of these religious congregations have been fully vaccinated against COVID-19. MPHS shall be strictly maintained.



The **DOH** shall identify the Alert Level of the pilot area.



This area shall **follow the protocols** consistent with the declared Alert Level.



For the duration of the pilot implementation, classification of the pilot area shall be done weekly, unless otherwise specified.

Close contacts, regardless of the vaccination status and possession of a negative COVID-19 test result, of probable and confirmed COVID-19 cases shall **undergo 14-day quarantine** in accordance with the isolation and quarantine protocols set by the DOH.





LGUs in pilot areas shall submit on a daily basis to their respective RIATF such data as determined by National Government Agencies

MPHS shall be implemented at all times











# Principles of 3C's (Closed, Crowded, and Close Contact)

strategy against COVID-19 to curb the further spread of infection

#### **GRANULAR LOCKDOWN**

Micro-level quarantine for areas identified as "critical zones" by the LGU which may be declared regardless of Alert Level

\*Granular lockdowns shall be for a period of not less than 14 days



#### **MOVEMENT**

Allowed to move within, into, and out of the area under granular lockdown

- Health care workers and non-health personnel working in hospitals, laboratories, and dialysis facilities
- Uniformed personnel tasked to enforce the granular lockdown

The following shall be allowed to enter and/or exit granular lockdown areas for specific purposes:

- OFWs bound for international travel, and those returning to their respective residences after having completed facility-based quarantine upon arrival;
- Individuals whose home or residence are located within an area under granular lockdown may enter the said area for the sole purpose of returning to their respective homes or residences but must thereafter remain therein for the duration of the granular lockdown;
- Individuals under exceptional circumstances such as, but not limited to, those seeking urgent medical attention as validated by the municipal/city health officer; and
- Food and essential items that are intended for delivery within an area under granular lockdown provided that they can only be unloaded at border collection points designated by the LGU.

"The findings of auditing that handles PS-DBM really pertained more to inventory management and not the overpricing. 
