DTI grabs top honors in CESB's Annual Awards

The Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) bagged the 2014 Top Placement Award given by the Career Executive Service Board (CESB) last 11 November 2015 at the Diosdado Macapagal Hall, Landbank Plaza, Manila.

CESB, the governing body of the Career Executive Service (CES), hosted an Appreciation Night to recognize outstanding individual and institutional partners. DTI triumphed over other government agencies for attaining the highest percentage of Third Level positions occupied by Career Executive Service Officers and Eligibles (CESOs and CESEs) in 2014.

Cruz proudly received the Plaque of Recognition as Head of the Human Resource and Administrative Service (HRAS), the support unit held primarily accountable for the placement of Third Level Officials for the agency.
